RESEARCHERS' NIGHT FESTIVAL - DNA WORKSHOP

When I was a young girl, I remember how my grandfather used to mention something like how analogies are important and I have to understand them and use them. It took me 20 years to realize the brilliance of it.

If we search for an exact definition on the Internet we could see next:

Analogy is a cognitive process of transferring information or meaning from a particular subject (the analog, or source) to another (the target), or a linguistic expression corresponding to such a process. The term analogy can also refer to the relation between the source and the target themselves, which is often (though not always) a similarity, as in the biological notion of analogy.

Analogy plays a significant role in problem solving, as well as decision making, argumentation, perception, generalization, memory, creativity, invention, prediction, emotion, explanation, conceptualization and communication.

Somewhere in January, while I was working behind the huge cutting machine in TYPA and making notebooks, I noticed certain similarities between that and the processes that are happening inside of our cells - replication, transcription and translation of DNA.

In today's world, we often hear terms as sustainability, climate change, pollution etc. Whereas those are hot topics and environmental awareness is necessary, I wanted to switch focus onto the other end of the biological scale of living things. What means when someone says "I inherited it from my mother or father", "why I have blue eyes and my friend brown", or "how tall will I grow".

Everything that happens in outer world will have direct or indirect impact on our inner organization, and will change or damage our genetic information. Recent studies in human and molecular genetics provide an opportunity to understand how genes and genetic changes interact with environmental stimuli to either preserve health or cause disease. The fields of environmental genetics and environmental genomics have enormous potential to affect our ability to accurately assess the risk of developing disease, identify and understand basic pathogenic mechanisms that are critical to disease progression. This is the future of the medicine - tailoring of treatment to the unique molecular or genetic mapping of individual patients.

The deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA), contains the instructions for the structure and functioning of all living organisms. With the help of paper models my workshop explored how the molecule of DNA is structured and built, and where it is "packed" in cells.


